

Goods worth RM50,000 seized from supermarket

KUALA LUMPUR: The Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Ministry seized 1,767kg of cooking oil, 2,538kg of wheat flour and 1,397kg of sugar amounting to more than RM50,000 from a popular supermarket in Setiawangsa following a recent spot check. The ministry said the supermarket was suspected to have committed two offences — possessing scheduled controlled goods in excess of the allowed amount and failing to maintain a stock book. The inspection was also done to assess whether the supermarket complied with the Recovery Movement Control Order as it had been approved to operate around the clock by the Kuala Lumpur Crisis Management Centre on June 12. “It was found that the supermarket owner failed to understand the issued standard operating procedures.” **Bernama**
