

Over 91,000 operations carried out to ensure CMCO SOP compliance

PUTRAJAYA: The Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Ministry (KPDNHEP) has carried out 91,403 operations on business premises nationwide to ensure compliance with standard operating procedures (SOPs) under the Conditional Movement Control Order (CMCO).

The premises include supermarkets, grocery stores, restaurants, bakeries, clothing retail stores and automobile repair shops.

Senior Minister (Security Cluster) Datuk Seri Ismail Sabri Yaakob said on Tuesday alone, KPDNHEP enforcement officers conducted 1,365 checks for SOP compliance.

He said of the number, 1,202 premises were found to be in compliance, while 160 were given advice, and three were issued warnings.

In conjunction with the Hari Raya Aidilfitri celebration, KPDNHEP is also enforcing the festive season price control scheme, and regularly checks for any price hikes on daily essential items, he said.

On another matter, Ismail Sabri said food supplies in the country are sufficient to cater to domestic needs.

He also addressed the issue of children and the elderly being brought along by family members to go shopping, and called for the practice to stop, as the two groups are at high risk of contracting Covid-19.

"Always adhere to the SOPs set by the Health Ministry, practise social distancing and good personal hygiene," he said.
