

Ministry assures sufficient supply of food during MCO

MIRI: There is adequate supply of essential items including food with no panic buying since the movement control order (MCO) came into force on March 18.

Miri Ministry of Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs (KPDNHEP) head Joe Azmi Jamil said checks were conducted by 20 enforcement officers at 680 business premises covering supermarkets, hypermarkets, public markets and grocery shops throughout Miri between March 18 and 29.

"There is sufficient supply of essential items in Miri for the whole period of the MCO.

"Our inspection showed no price hike with most businesses adhering to the rules and regulation imposed. No legal action has been taken," said Joe when contacted yesterday.

"We will continue to do daily monitoring and inspection to ensure essential items are sufficient so that people would not resort to panic buying following the extension of MCO until April 14," he added.
